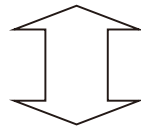

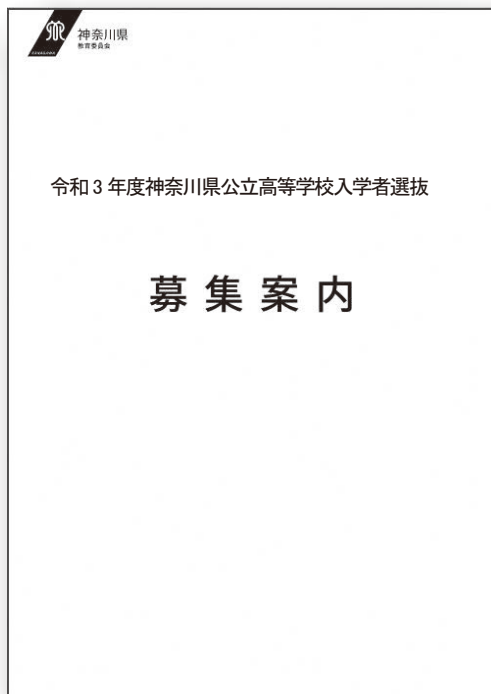

Before the Examination · · · Basic information

1. Types of High Schools

High schools in Kanagawa Prefecture can be divided into public high schools and private high schools. They can be further divided into 3 types according to the periods of time of classes.

(Numbers listed below are those of high schools which conduct entrance examinations for the school year 2021.)

(1) Differences between Public and Private High Schools

Public High Schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Established by the Prefecture and municipalities • There are 135 prefectural and 15 municipal high schools in Kanagawa. • People residing in Kanagawa may apply. • For <i>Teiji</i> (Part-Time) and <i>Tsushin</i> (Correspondence) high schools, people working in Kanagawa are also eligible to apply. <p>【 Examination 】 There are two types: <i>Kyotsu</i> (common) Examination conducted by all the public high schools in a unified manner and <i>Tei-tsu Bunkatsu</i> (part-time and correspondence division) Examination conducted by part-time (night) and correspondence high schools. 📄 P.4</p>
Private High Schools	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Privately established. • Each high school has its own curriculum based on their original educational policies. • There are 58 private high schools in Kanagawa. <p>【 Examination 】 Examination and its dates are different from school to school. There are 3 ways to take examination of private high schools: “<i>Sengan (Tangan)</i>” to take examination of only one private high school, “<i>Heigan</i>” to take examination of one public and one private high schools, and “Open” to take examination of multiple private high schools. In case of “<i>Sengan (Tangan)</i>” or “<i>Heigan</i>”, applicants must enter the high school they applied to when accepted. If the applicant declines to enter the high school accepted, he/she will not be able to take examination for other high schools.</p>

(2) Differences among *Zennichi* (Full-Time), *Teiji* (Part-Time), and *Tsushin* (Correspondence) Systems

The three systems have different styles of learning.

<i>Zennichi</i> (Full-Time)	<p>There is school every day, from about 8:40 a.m. to about 3:30 p.m.</p> <p>It takes 3 years to graduate. 146 public high schools have this system.</p>
<i>Teiji</i> (Part-Time)	<p>Classes are held in a certain specified time period (morning, afternoon or evening/night), and many of the schools offer classes in the evening/night. 27 public high schools have this system.</p> <p>There are high schools called “Flexible School”, where you can attend classes according to the schedule made for your needs.</p> <p>It will take 4 years to graduate, however in some schools, students can graduate in 3 years.</p>

<i>Tsushin</i> (Correspondence)	<p>In this system, students earn credits by passing the exams after submitting papers written at home using textbooks and workbooks. This system is offered in two public high schools.</p> <p>Students are required to go to school not every day but two or three times a month to meet with their teachers in person for guidance (“schooling”).</p> <p>In some <i>Tsushin</i> system schools, “schooling” is offered on weekdays to help students write papers. There is also a school utilizing the Internet for teaching.</p>
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- (3) Differences between *Gakunen* (yearly advance) and *Tan-i* (credit-based) Systems
Gakunen and *Tan-i* system schools have their own way of dividing classes and grades.

<i>Gakunen</i> system (yearly advance)	Most of the subjects (curriculum) are set based on the grade level.
<i>Tan-i</i> system (credit-based)	There are no grade divisions. Students may graduate when the necessary credits have been earned.

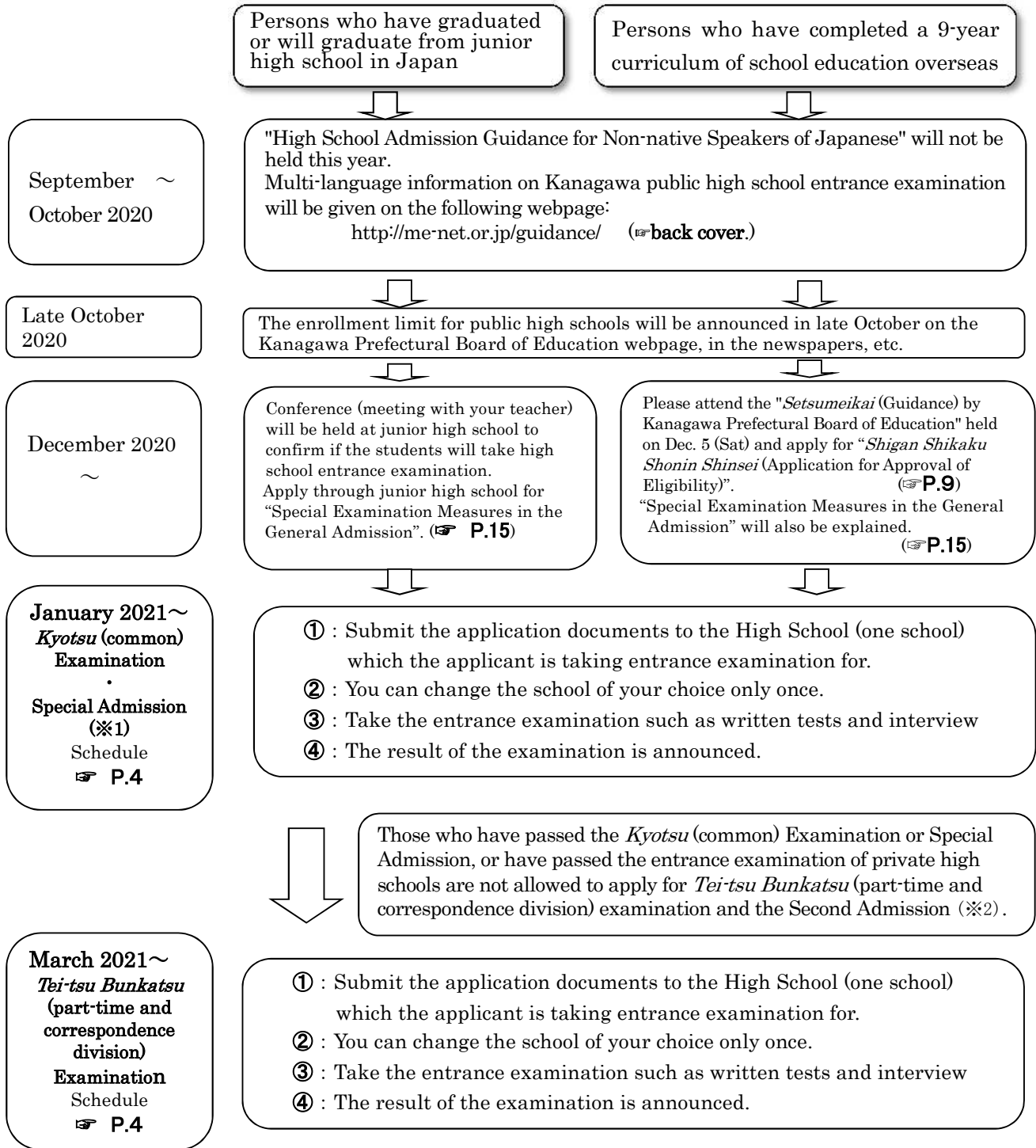
- (4) *Futsu-ka* (General), *Senmon* (Specialized), and *Sogo* (Comprehensive) Courses
Courses vary depending on the type of study.
Public High Schools in Kanagawa have the following courses:

<i>Futsu-ka</i> (General)	<p>General subjects, such as Japanese, Geography and History, Civics, Social Studies, Mathematics, Science and English are studied in this course. This is the most common course.</p> <p>-<i>Gakunen</i> system (yearly advance): 101 Full-Time, 11 Part-Time schools</p> <p>-<i>Tan-i</i> (credit-based) system: 16 Full-Time, 7 Part-Time, 2 Correspondence schools</p>
<i>Futsu-ka Senmon</i> (Specialized Courses in the General)	<p>Students study specialized fields in addition to the general subjects. Yokohama Municipal Totsuka High School’s music course is this type of course.</p> <p>-<i>Tan-i</i> (credit-based) system: one Full-Time school</p>
<i>Senmon</i> (Specialized)	<p>Subjects taught include Agriculture, Industry, Business, Fishery, Homemaking, Nursing, Welfare, Science, Physical Education, Music, Fine Arts, International Affairs, International Relations, General Industry and Performing Arts. Students learn specialized knowledge and basic technology.</p> <p>-<i>Gakunen</i> system (yearly advance): 25 Full-Time, 3 Part-Time schools</p> <p>-<i>Tan-i</i> (credit-based) system: 8 Full-Time schools</p>
<i>Sogo</i> (Comprehensive)	<p>Students can choose distinctive subjects from various subjects taught in General and Specialized courses and study in <i>Tan-i</i> (credit-based) system.</p> <p>-<i>Tan-i</i> (credit-based) system: 8 Full-Time, 6 Part-Time schools</p>

※1 Special admissions are "Special Admission for Prefectural Foreign Residents, etc." conducted by 13 high schools, and "Special Admissions for Students Returning from Abroad" conducted by 8 high schools. Eligibility☞ P.5

※2 The second admission for full-time high schools and part-time high schools (except for night schools) will be conducted in early March by some of the high schools which are under enrolled through the Common Examination. The second admission will be conducted on a separate schedule from *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) Examination and you can apply for both. For part-time (night) high schools and correspondence high schools, the second admission will be conducted in late March by some of the high schools which are under enrolled through *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) Examination.

- In case of part-time high schools which have two or more sessions (such as morning and afternoon sessions), applicants can write their first and second choices in the application form. In case of specialized course high schools that have two or more departments in agriculture, industry, business or fishery courses, applicants can write their first and second choices in the application form as well. For Prefectural Yokohama Kokusai High school (Yokohama Senior High School of International Studies), applicants for International Studies Course (except for International Baccalaureate Course) and International Baccalaureate Course can write their first and second choices in the application form. The second choice, however, is taken into consideration only when the acceptance limit is not filled with the applicants of the first choice.

5. Reduction/Exemption System of Public High School Entrance Examination Fees and Enrollment Fees

- By this system, persons who have difficulties in paying the entrance examination fees and enrollment fees for financial reasons are exempt from payment in full or in part. (See **P.16** for enrollment fees.)
 - To Apply, consult with the office of the school you wish to enter.
Application procedure has to be completed by the following dates:
Entrance examination fees ··· The day before the Application Form submission
Enrollment fees ··········· The day before the enrollment procedures (Within a few days after the result announcement of the entrance examination)

Those who have completed a 9-year curriculum of school education overseas need to go through the procedures to obtain approval of eligibility and are advised to attend the following guidance.

Setsumeikai (Guidance) held by the Board of Education (for students from Other Prefectures and Foreign Countries ▪ interpreter available)

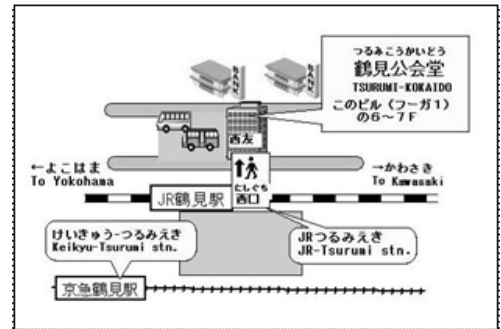

★ If you are currently enrolled in a public junior high school in Kanagawa Prefecture, you may not attend the guidance mentioned above.

○ How to Apply for Approval of Eligibility

【Persons who live in Kanagawa Prefecture with guardians (Persons who qualify to apply to *Zennichi-sei* (Full-time system) high schools)】

You need to apply for “*Shigan Shikaku Shonin Shinsei* (Application for Approval of Eligibility)” at the Prefectural Board of Education (*Koko Kyoiku-ka*) between December 7 (Mon) and January 19 (Tue).
(Map ↗ P.18)

【Documents you need to submit】

- ① A document stating you and your guardian(s) are residing or will reside in Kanagawa Prefecture.
(a document that states you and your guardian’s address and relationship such as *Juminhyo*, residency certificate)
- ② A document stating you have completed a 9-year curriculum of school education overseas.
(a diploma from a Junior High School in a foreign country, etc.)
- ③ *Shigan Shikaku Shonin Shinsei-sho* (Application form for Approval of Eligibility) (Form No.15)

If your eligibility to apply to public high schools in Kanagawa Prefecture is approved, you will be given *Shigan Shikaku Shonin-sho* (Certificate of Approval of Eligibility). You have to submit this certificate with the application form to the school you wish to apply to.

【Persons whose guardians do not live in Kanagawa Prefecture (Persons who qualify to apply only to *Teiji-sei* (part-time system) and *Tsushin-sei* (correspondence system) high schools)】

You can apply (using Form No.18) for approval of eligibility at the office of the school that you wish to enter. Submit the necessary documents shown above with the application form to the school.
(The document to certify the address is required only for the applicant.)

★ If you yourself live in Kanagawa Prefecture, or if you do not live in but work in Kanagawa Prefecture, you will be able to obtain eligibility to apply for part-time and correspondence systems even if your guardian does not live in Kanagawa.

Selection Method (how admission decisions are made)

In part-time high schools, the selection for all of the number accepted is made using the same method as the first selection of the common examination. (☞ P.12)

In the correspondence schools, the selection for all of the number accepted is made comprehensively using *Chousa Sho* and the results of the tests conducted.

(4) *Tokubetsuna Juken Hoho* (Special Examination Measures) in the General Admission

Special examination measures are for the persons taking examinations for the general admission. Applications for the special examination measures can be accepted at any public high schools that accept application for general admission.

【Who May Apply】

In principle, persons who immigrated to Japan from abroad in the past 6 years (as of February 1, 2021)

【How To Apply】

Applicants must submit "*Kaigai-karano Ijusha-tou-wo hogosha-to-suru Shigansha-no Juken-hoho-tou Shinseisho* (Application for Special Examination Measures for Persons Whose Guardians Have Immigrated to Japan)" (Form No.5) to the school before applying.

Application will be necessary for each of *Kyotsu* (common) examination and *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) examination.

This application is issued in the name of the principal of your junior high school.

Consult with **your homeroom teacher** at an early date if you consider it necessary.

If you are not enrolled in junior high school, inquire at **the high school you wish to enter at an early date**.

【Special examination measures that you can apply for】

- ① On "written tests" (including other tests), examination sentences have *rubi* (*hiragana* beside Chinese characters).
- ② Test time is extended to 1.5 times at the maximum.
- ③ At the interviews, interviewers speak slower in plain words.

★ You cannot take examinations with the help of an interpreter nor dictionaries.

★ For examinations of the "Special Admission for Prefectural Foreign Residents, etc.", the above measures ① and ③ will be taken, and there are no special procedures for you to take in advance.

However, if you do not pass the examination and take the *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* examination, you will have to apply for the above.

If there is a possibility to take the *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* examination, make an application at an early date.

10. School Fees

You need to pay school fees (educational expenses) when studying at high school. You also need to pay enrollment fee.

Full-Time Schools

The approximate amounts of school fees necessary for one year are as follows.

Public High Schools (Full-Time): About 200,000 yen (for the first year of enrollment)

Public High Schools (Part-Time): About 40,000 yen (for the first year of enrollment)

Private High Schools (Full-Time): About 800,000 yen~ (for the first year of enrollment)

You need to pay a good part of the amounts shown above when going through the procedure in March to enter the high school. For the full-time high school general course, the amount to be paid in March will be around 100,000 yen which includes fees for textbooks, teaching materials, school uniform, PE uniform and athletic shoes. For specialized courses, you may need to pay practical work fees in addition.

Other than those shown above, commuting expenses (transportation fees), club activity fees, stationery fees, Judo uniform and/or swim wear fees for PE classes and reserve for school excursion fees may be necessary.

For the households on public assistance or low-income households exempted from taxation, there is a scholarship system named Kanagawa Prefecture High School Supplemental Scholarship Fund for which repayment is unnecessary. Application will be accepted at each high school starting from July.

There are other financial aid systems such as “Kanagawa High School Financial Aid” for the students who have financial difficulty. There are two types of aid, grant type (repayment unnecessary) and loan type (repayment necessary). Please confirm the conditions of payment for each financial aid.

11. High School Tuition Support Fund

This government aid provides students with High School Tuition Support Fund to be applied to tuition to reduce the burden of household educational costs. The system aims to create a society in which all the motivated high school students can continue their studies regardless of their economic situation. They are expected to take active roles in the future in society realizing that their learning is supported by the entire society. (**This is not a student loan and repayment is unnecessary.**)

In case of public high schools, if you are eligible to receive payments from High School Tuition Support Fund, you do not need to pay tuition.

To use this system, you will need to apply. Explanations will be made and the necessary documents will be given at the high school the student is enrolled.

◎ Translated documents are also available. Please consult at the high school the student is enrolled if you think it is necessary.

<Conditions of Payment>

- Households where the amount calculated using the following formula regarding the income of guardians (persons with parental authority, if there are father and mother, total of both) is less than 304,200yen (It is approximately equivalent to the annual income of 9,100,000 yen.)

【Calculation formula】 Tax base amount of Municipal tax × 6% – Municipal tax adjustment deduction amount

- Households receiving public assistance

<Application Documents>

- ① Application form (distributed through the high school at the time of examination result announcement, etc.)
- ② A copy of “my number (individual number)” card or other documentation of each of the guardians (persons with parental authority) (ex: individual number card, individual number notification card, *Juminhyo* (residency certificate) which shows individual number, certificate of entry in the residency certificate)

<Application Period>

Application is necessary once at the time of entrance into the high school as a general rule. Application deadline will be informed by the high school of the student.

12. Tuition Support System for Private High Schools

In Kanagawa Prefecture, support fund for which repayment is unnecessary is provided for entrance fee and tuition to reduce the economic burden of guardians of the students enrolled in private high schools and so on. Entrance fee and tuition, however, should be paid to the school at the time of enrollment and the support fund will be provided later after the enrollment. For details, contact the private high school the student is enrolled.

(Example)

Households with annual income less than about 7,000,000 yen and households on public assistance

Support fund for Tuition: 444,000 yen

Households with annual income less than about 7,500,000 yen

Support fund for Tuition: 193,200 yen

Households with annual income less than about 9,100,000 yen

Support fund for Tuition: 118,800 yen

Examples shown above are amounts of tuition support funds for the students who reside in Kanagawa Prefecture and are enrolled in private high schools and so on in Kanagawa Prefecture.

The amount of support fund is determined using “Standard amount based on income” of the guardians (persons with parental authority, if the student has father and mother, total of both.)

13. Re-enrollment in High School

① Re-enrollment (*Sai-nyugaku*)

When a student leaves high school after attending for a year or more, and enters high school again, it is called *Sai-nyugaku* (re-enrollment).

If a student has attended school overseas which corresponds to that of Japan's high school, and then enters Japan's high school, it is also called *Sai-nyugaku* (re-enrollment).

To re-enroll in a high school, you need to pass a re-enrollment examination (“interview”, “written tests”, etc.) of the school that accepts re-enrollment.

★ In order to re-enroll in public high schools (full-time) in Kanagawa Prefecture, the applicant and his/her guardian(s) must reside within Kanagawa Prefecture.

② Re-enrollment of Students Who Have Attended Overseas High Schools

To re-enroll in a Japanese high school, the student must have completed a 10-year or more of a school education curriculum overseas.

In principle, students can re-enroll in a high school on April 1. “Written tests” and “interviews” are usually conducted in March using Japanese language.


It is also possible to apply for the “Special Admission for Prefectural Foreign Residents, etc.”, when there is an opening in the allotment of the “Special Admission for Prefectural Foreign Residents, etc.” of the school, and the applicant is eligible to apply. (See **P.5** for eligibility.)

The principal of the high school that accepts the student's re-enrollment will decide the student's grade level (or its equivalent) to be enrolled after the student is admitted.

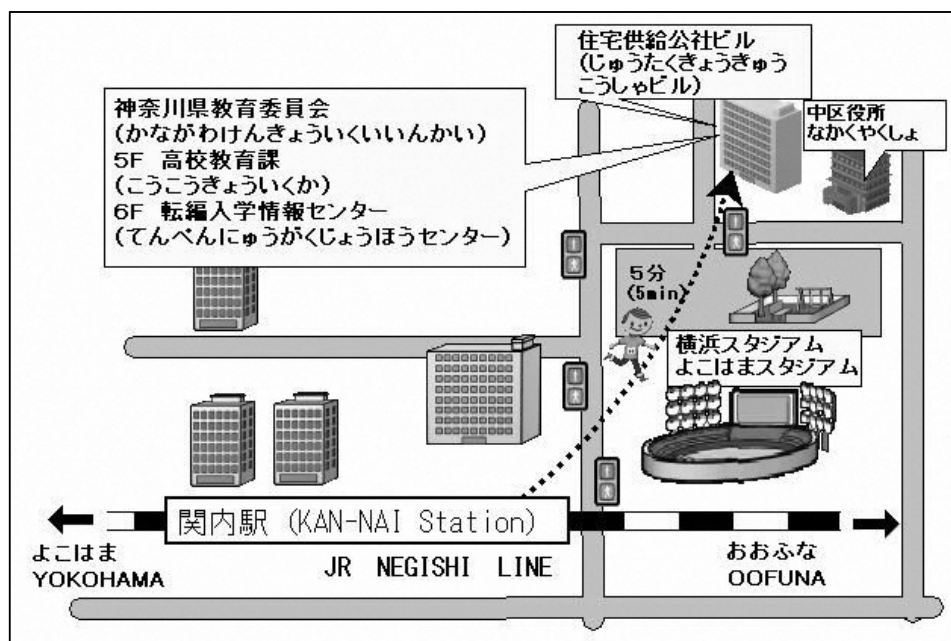
