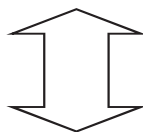

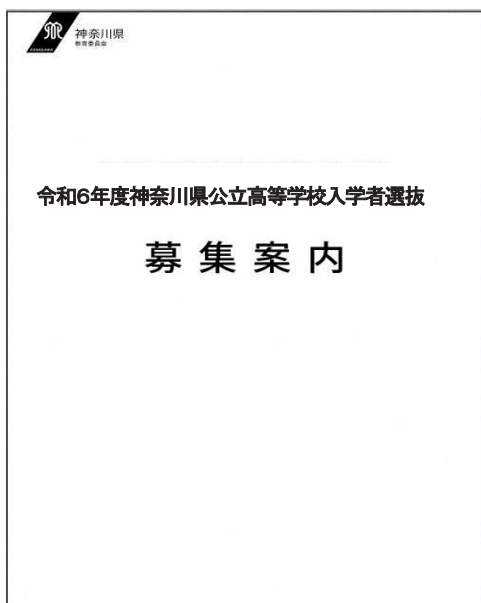

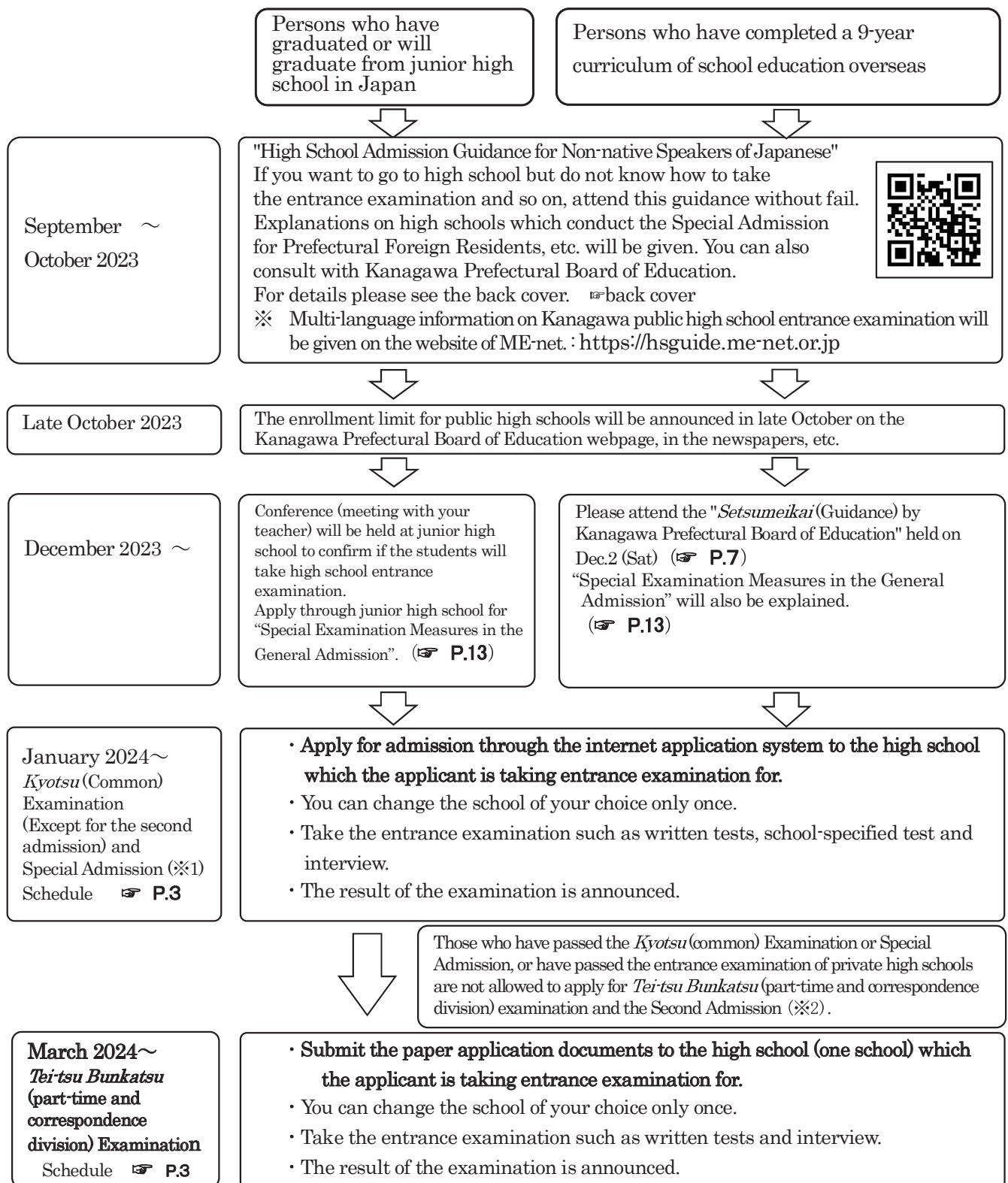

1 Schedule flow for Taking High School Entrance Examination

Please participate in School Information Meeting held by each high school and "High School Admission Guidance for Non-native Speakers of Japanese" actively!



(※1) Special admissions are "Special Admission for Prefectural Foreign Residents, etc." conducted by 20 high schools, and "Special Admissions for Students Returning from Abroad" conducted by 8 high schools. Eligibility (P.2)

(※2) The second admission for full-time high schools and part-time high schools (except for night schools) will be conducted in early March by some of the high schools which are under enrolled through the Common Examination. The second admission will be conducted on a separate schedule from Tei-tsu Bunkatsu (part-time and correspondence division) Examination and you can apply for both. For part-time (night) high schools and correspondence high schools, the second admission will be conducted in late March by some of the high schools which are under enrolled through Tei-tsu Bunkatsu (part-time and correspondence division) Examination.





- You can apply for one course of one school.
- In case of part-time high schools which have two or more sessions (such as morning and afternoon sessions), applicants can write another session as the second choice in the application form. In case of specialized course high schools that have two or more departments in agriculture, industry, business or fishery courses, applicants can write another department as their second choice in the application form. The second choice, however, is taken into consideration only when the acceptance limit is not filled with the applicants with the first choice.
- For Prefectural Yokohama Kokusai High school (Yokohama Senior High school of International Studies), applicants for International Studies Course (except for International Baccalaureate Course) and International Baccalaureate Course can write the other course of the high school as the second choice in the application form.

(3) Interview Sheet

When the high school the applicant is applying to requires the interview sheet, the applicant should write about his/her own thoughts by him/herself and submit it to the high school applying to. Japanese language have to be used in filling out this sheet. This sheet will be used as a reference at the time of the interview and the contents of the sheet will not be evaluated as a part of the examination. In case if the applicant changes the school to apply to and the newly chosen school requires an interview sheet, he/she needs to prepare an interview sheet anew and submit it to the newly chosen school. A copy of the interview sheet is allowed to be submitted. Some of the schools specify their own form of interview sheet for submission instead of the standard interview sheet.

○ How to Apply for Approval of Eligibility

【Persons who live in Kanagawa Prefecture with guardians (Persons who qualify to apply to *Zennichi-sei* (Full-time system) high schools)】

You need to apply for approval of eligibility “*Shigan Shikaku Shonin Shinsei*” at the guidance on December 2 or at the Prefectural Board of Education (*Koko Kyoiku-ka*) between December 4 (Mon) and January 16 (Tue) .

⟨Documents required⟩

- ① A document stating you and your guardian(s) are residing or will reside in Kanagawa Prefecture. (a document that states you and your guardian’s address and relationship such as *Juminhyo*, residency certificate)

② A document stating you have completed a 9-year curriculum of school education overseas.
(A certificate such as a diploma from a junior high school in a foreign country will be confirmed using the original certificate.)

③ *Shigan Shikaku Shonin Shinsei-sho* (Application form for Approval of Eligibility) (Form No.15)
(You can visit the webpage of Prefectural Board of Education and download the form.)

For *Kyotsu* (Common) Examination (except for the second admission), when the eligibility for application to Kanagawa Prefectural Public High Schools is approved, you can apply through the internet application system. For the special admission, procedures shown on page 5 are also required.

For *Kyotsu* (Common) Examination (the second admission) and *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) Examination, you need to receive *Shigan Shikaku Shonin-sho* (approval of eligibility for application) from the Prefectural Board of Education and submit it together with the application form to the high school applying to.

【Persons whose guardians do not live in Kanagawa Prefecture (Persons who qualify to apply only to *Teiji-sei* (part-time system) and *Tsushin-sei* (correspondence system) high schools※)】

Apply for the eligibility approval to apply to part-time/correspondence system schools (Form No. 18) at the office of the school applying to. Present the necessary documents ① and ② shown above. (The document to certify the address is required for the applicant only.)

※ For part-time system and correspondence system schools, eligibility is approved if the **applicant** lives in Kanagawa Prefecture, or his/her workplace is located in Kanagawa Prefecture.

7 Entrance Examination

(1) Details of Examination for General Admission

- For the details of subjects of “written tests” and “school-specified tests” of each school, see the “*Boshu Annai* (Application Guide)” (a booklet in Japanese published by the Kanagawa Prefectural Board of Education, which is distributed to 3rd graders in public junior high schools in Kanagawa Prefecture in July.)
- Those who have passed the *Kyotsu* (common) Examination, special admission examination or the entrance examination of private high schools and others are not allowed to apply for *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) examination. (☞ P.12)
※ They cannot apply for *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* examination even if they decline entrance into those schools.
- Test time for each subject of written tests is 50 minutes. If you want special measures in the general admission, you need to apply for it. (☞ P.13)
- The written test questions for full-time high schools and part-time high schools are different.

(f, g and i represent ratios respectively.)

Example of Ratios (f:g:i)

- (Ex.1) This high school puts weight on grade points obtained in junior high school and no school-specified test is conducted. (8:2:0)
 (Ex.2) This high school puts weight on written test score and no school-specified test is conducted. (3:7:0)
 (Ex.3) This high school puts weight on written test score and school-specified test score. (3:7:4)

Ratio (f) represents the ratio of the grade points obtained in junior high school, ratio (g) represents the ratio of the written test score and ratio (i) represents the ratio of school-specified test score respectively.

② How admission decisions are made

After the entrance examination, the successful applicants are decided in an order of the first selection and then the second selection in each school.

First Selection	The applicants whose total score S is in the top 90% will be accepted.
Second Selection	Applicants are accepted up to the enrollment limit using the total score S calculated again not using the overall evaluation a in the <i>Chousa Sho</i> but using b (including d for schools conducting school-specified tests) and evaluation of "attitude toward learning subjects independently" in the third grade shown in <i>Chousa Sho</i> . In the evaluation of "attitude", grade A is converted to 3, B to 2 and C to 1 respectively and the total score (C) of them is converted into the number in 100-point scale to obtain c . Then, based on the ratio determined by each school (g, h, and for schools with school-specified test i) total score S mentioned above is obtained.

- ※ For prefectural Yokohama Kokusai High school (Yokohama Senior High School of International Studies), prefectural Yokohama Meiho High School, prefectural Sagami Kouyokan High School and "creative schools", please confirm the selection method using the "*Boshu Annai* (Application Guide)" or other documents. The selection methods for those schools are different.
 ※ In the correspondence schools, the selection is made comprehensively using *Chousa Sho* and the results of the tests conducted.
 ※ In all the examinations for full-time, part-time and correspondence systems, selections will be made with consideration given to those applicants whose documents in part, such as junior HS evaluation of subjects, are not prepared.

8 ***Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) Examination [conducted by part-time night high schools and correspondence high schools]**

※ Those who have passed the *Kyotsu* (common) Examination or have passed the entrance examination of private high schools are not allowed to apply for *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) examination.

★ For Changing the School of Your Choice

- You can change the school of your choice only once.
- You must go through the following 2 steps to change the school.
 - ① Go to the school you have applied to first, and receive the documents. (You need to fill out a new application form in case you apply for a different system school. Please check at the office counter of the school.)
 - ② After you receive the documents in ①, take them to the new school and submit them. If you change to a school which conducts school-specified test (interview), you need to submit your interview sheet also.

(2) Details of Examination

Part-time High School	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Written Tests (3 subjects: English, Japanese, and Mathematics, Test time for each subject : 30 minutes) • Some of the schools conduct school-specified tests such as an interview, practical test and/or a self-expression test.

(3) Selection Method (how admission decisions are made)

- In part-time high schools, the selection is made using the calculation method based on the overall evaluation (for the second and third grades) in *Chousa Sho* and the result of the examination conducted.
- In the correspondence schools, the selection is made comprehensively using *Chousa Sho* and the results of the tests conducted.

〈Special Examination Measures in the General Admission (“*Kyotsu* (common) examination” and “*Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) examination”)〉

【Who May Apply】

- In principle, persons who immigrated to Japan from abroad in the past 6 years (as of February 1, 2024) can apply. Application for the special examination measures can be accepted at any public high schools that accept application for general admission.

【How To Apply】

- Applicants must submit “*Kaigai-karano Ijusha-tou-wo hogosha-to-suru Shigansha-no Juken-hoho-tou Shinseisho* (Application for Special Examination Measures for Persons Whose Guardians Have Immigrated to Japan)” (Form No.5) to the school before applying. Application will be necessary for each of *Kyotsu* (common) examination and *Tei-tsu Bunkatsu* (part-time and correspondence division) examination.
- Application documents will be submitted through your junior high school. Consult with your homeroom teacher at an early date.
- If you are not enrolled in junior high school, inquire at the high school you wish to enter at an early date.

【Special examination measures that you can apply for (Example)】

- On “written tests” (including other tests), examination sentences have *rubi* (*hiragana* beside Chinese characters).
- Test time is extended to 1.5 times at the maximum.
- At the school-specified test (interview), examiners speak slower in plain words.
- You cannot take examinations with the help of an interpreter nor dictionaries.
- You cannot apply for the special examination measures mentioned above in Special Admission for Prefectural Foreign Residents, etc. and in Special Admission for Students Returning from Abroad.
- If you need special consideration in taking examinations, please consult with the Kanagawa Prefectural Board of Education.

9 Reduction/Exemption System of Public High School Entrance Examination Fees and Enrollment Fees

- Reduction/Exemption System of Entrance Examination Fees and Enrollment Fees : By this system, persons who have difficulties in paying the entrance examination fees and enrollment fees for financial reasons are exempt from payment in full or in part.
- How To Apply • • • Consult with the office of the school you wish to enter.
Application procedure has to be completed by the following dates:
Entrance examination fees: The day before the application form submission
Enrollment fees : The day before the enrollment procedures (Within a few days after the result announcement of the entrance examination)
(If the due date is passed, reduction/exemption of these fees will not be given.)

10 School Fees

You need to pay school fees (educational expenses) when studying at high school. You also need to pay enrollment fee.

Full-Time Schools

The approximate amounts of school fees necessary for one year are as follows.

(For Your Reference)

Public High Schools (Full-Time): About 200,000 yen (for the first year of enrollment)

Public High Schools (Part-Time): About 40,000 yen (for the first year of enrollment)

Private High Schools (Full-Time): About 900,000 yen~ (for the first year of enrollment)

You need to pay a good part of the amounts shown above when going through the procedures in March to enter the high school after passing the examination. For the full-time high school general course, the amount to be paid will be around 140,000 yen which includes fees for textbooks, teaching materials, school uniform, PE uniform, athletic shoes and tablet device. For specialized courses, you may need to pay practical work fees in addition.

Other than those shown above, commuting expenses (transportation fees), club activity fees, stationery fees, Judo uniform and/or swim wear fees for PE classes and reserve for school excursion fees may be necessary.

Contact each school for details. In private high schools, fees required vary from school to school. Please be sure to confirm beforehand at the school information meeting and so on.

For the households on public assistance or low-income households exempted from taxation, there is a scholarship system named Kanagawa Prefecture High School Supplemental Scholarship Fund for which repayment is unnecessary. Application will be accepted at each high school starting from July.

There are other financial aid systems such as “Kanagawa High School Financial Aid” for the students who have financial difficulty. These are student loans with no interest for the students who need financial aid for educational expenses and the students are required to pay back in the future.

11 High School Tuition Support Fund

This is to provide students with High School Tuition Support Fund to be applied to tuition to reduce the burden of household educational costs. The system aims to create a society in which all the motivated high school students can continue their studies regardless of their economic situation.

They are expected to take active roles in the future in society realizing that their learning is supported by the entire society. **(This is not a student loan and repayment is unnecessary.)**

In case of public high schools, if you are eligible to receive payments from High School Tuition Support Fund, you do not need to pay tuition.

To use this system, you will need to apply. Explanations will be made and the necessary documents will be given at the high school the student is enrolled.

◎Translated documents are also available. Please consult at the high school the student is enrolled if you think it is necessary.

<Conditions of Payment>

- Households where the amount calculated using the following formula regarding the income of guardians (persons with parental authority, if there are father and mother, total of both) is less than 304,200yen (It is approximately equivalent to the annual income of 9,100,000 yen.)

【Calculation formula】 Tax base amount of Municipal tax × 6% —Municipal tax adjustment deduction amount

- Households receiving public assistance

<Application Documents>

A login ID and a password for online application will be provided by the high school. Use them to log in to “High School Tuition Support Fund Online Application System” and apply. (A login ID and a password are to be given from the high school at the time of enrollment procedures.)

※ My Number of the guardian(s), etc. is required for application.

You can also apply using the written form. Please contact the office of the high school if you want to apply in writing. Please note that the following documents are required to apply in writing.

A copy of My Number card or other documentation of each of the guardians (persons with parental authority) (such as *Juminhyo* (residency certificate) which shows My Number and certificate of entry in the residency certificate which shows My Number)

<Application Period>

Application is necessary once at the time of entrance into the high school as a general rule. (Application deadline will be informed by the high school of the student.)

※ Depending on the application method, you may need to follow some procedures in July every year.

12 Tuition Support System for Private High Schools

In Kanagawa Prefecture, support fund for which repayment is unnecessary is provided for entrance fee and tuition to reduce the economic burden of guardians of the students enrolled in private high schools and so on. For details, contact the private high school the student is enrolled.

(Example)

Households with annual income less than about 7,000,000 yen and households on public assistance

Support fund for Tuition: 456,000 yen

Households with annual income less than about 7,500,000 yen

Support fund for Tuition: 193,200 yen

Households with annual income less than about 8,000,000 yen with multiple children(※1)

Support fund for Tuition: 456,000 yen

Households with annual income less than about 9,100,000 yen

Support fund for Tuition: 118,800 yen

Households with annual income less than about 9,100,000 yen with multiple children

Support fund for Tuition: 193,200 yen

- Examples shown above are amounts of tuition support funds for the students who reside in Kanagawa Prefecture and are enrolled in private high schools and so on in Kanagawa Prefecture.
- The amount of support fund is determined using “Standard amount based on resident tax” of the guardians (persons with parental authority, if the student has father and mother, total of both.)
